


Meeting with our neighbors, under fun and positive circumstances, enhances trust and understanding.

BUS STOP SAFETY


In an effort to improve visibility at selected school bus stops, Sheriff Carmine Marceno placed LED message boards to generate attention and to remind drivers to drive cautiously.

and a great deal of fanfare.


